*Teach your lesson and make sure your students are familiar with the content.

1. Download your video clips- copyright OK (usually for educational purposes or for clips less than 10% or 3 minutes)- <http://tinyurl.com/23846z>

- United Streaming
- Other sources
- Create your own home video for students to narrate
- You can have students listen to the original to get ideas or just create their own audio from scratch. If they listen to the original, be sure to stress paraphrasing and not simply copying.

2. Microphones

- Different types- USB, input/output jacks, small wand, hand mic...
- adjustment- place microphone below mouth to avoid "puffs of air"

3. Open your video editor

- Windows Movie Maker
- iMovie
- other- Jumpcut, Premiere...

4. Import your clips- your editor will frequently break them into smaller clips

5. Mute the initial audio track
usually by right clicking on the
audio track

6. Click on the "Narrate" icon

7. Save your new video project.

8. Export your new movie (or "save movie as").

9. Publish your movie if desired. Dailymotion, Podomatic, Teachertube, your blog...
